Village to Village Network Model







What are Villages?

Supported primarily by volunteers who provide an array of support services, Villages enable older adults to live life independently in their homes and communities. Villages reflect their communities and respond to the needs of their members. While their business models may vary, their primary mission is to empower older adults to age successfully at home.

New villages will begin to form by identifying interest and informing people in the other neighborhoods.


Benefits of a County-wide Hub and Spoke Model

Administrative support for all spoke neighborhoods


Only one 501(c)3 covers all neighborhoods
